The Beginning: Faith and Repentance

Faith and Repentance Must come together

- A. **Repentance is** a heartfelt sorrow for sin, a renouncing of it, turning in obedience to Christ.
 - 1. Repentance is an intellectual understanding (that sin is wrong), an emotional approval of the teachings of Scripture (including a sorrow for sin and a hatred of it), and a personal decision to turn from it (a renouncing of sin and decision to forsake it and lead a life of obedience to Christ). (2 Cor 7:9-10)
 - 2. Repentance of Sin and Faith in Christ are two sides of the same coin taking place at the point of conversion and throughout our lives.
 - 3. Saving faith cannot occur without turning from Sin.

B. Salvation Requires acceptance of His Lordship

- 1. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me. (Matt 11:28-29)
- 2. In the scriptures, trusting God is tied to repentance. (Isa 55:6-7)
- 3. Repentance is Elementary. (Hebrews 6:1)
- 4. The Apostles tied Faith and Repentance together in their preaching. (Acts 3:19, Acts 5:31, Acts 17:30, Rom 2:4 2 For 7:10)
- 5. Jesus Did the same. (Luke 8:18-30, Luke 19:1-10, John 4:16, John 3L1-21) Note: The salvation prayer does not save us, the heart that trusts in Jesus is what saves us and it is often in a prayer that this occurs.

C. Faith and Repentance are ongoing

- 1. Jesus instruction on daily prayer included repentance and forgiveness. (Matt 6:12)
- 2. His love brings us to repentance. (Rev 3:19)
- 3. Faith extends throughout life. (1 Cor 13:13)
- 4. We live by faith. (Gal 2:20)

D. Questions

- 1. Did you feel sincere sorrow for sin when you first came to Christ? Did it lead to a commitment to leave sin? How did that feel and how did your life change?
- 2. Have you heard a gospel that did not include repentance of Sin?
- 3. Have faith and repentance remained a part of your life or have those ideas grown weak in your heart over time? If they have faded, how has that affected your life?
